Languages in Maryland

- Montgomery County's 96 languages tied for the 11th highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Maryland counties that were highly ranked included: Baltimore County (t-45), Prince George's County (t-47), Baltimore city (t-116), Howard County (t-133) and Anne Arundel County (t-155).
- Maryland has the highest percentage of speakers of Bantu, Chadic, Efik, Kru/Ibo/Yoruba, Mande, Sinhalese and Swahili in the United States. The Old Line State also ranks second in the percentage of Amharic, Kannada, Krio and Tamil speakers and third in the percentage of Burmese, Hebrew, Marathi and Persian speakers.
- Prince George's County has the highest percentage of Kru/Ibo/Yoruba speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Montgomery County (second, Sinhalese).
