Languages in Massachusetts

- Middlesex County's 86 languages tied for the 21st highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Massachusetts counties that were highly ranked included: Suffolk County (t-25), Worcester County (t-77), Norfolk County (t-83), Essex County (t-108) and Hampden County (t-146).
- Massachusetts has the highest percentage of speakers of Irish Gaelic in the United States. The Bay State also ranks second in the percentage of French Creole, Greek, Mon-Khmer/Cambodian and Portuguese speakers and third in the percentage of Armenian, Lithuanian, Micmac, Nepali, Russian and Tamil speakers.
- Bristol County has the highest percentage of Portuguese speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Norfolk County (third, Irish Gaelic) and Suffolk County (fourth, French Creole).
