## Languages in New Hampshire

- Hillsborough County's 54 languages tied for the 133rd highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other New Hampshire counties that were highly ranked included: Rockingham County (t-294) and Merrimack County (t-325).
- New Hampshire has the second highest percentage of speakers of Micmac, Scottish Gaelic and Sindhi in the United States. The Granite State also ranks third in the percentage of French and Kurdish speakers and fourth in the percentage of Icelandic speakers.
- Coos County has the ninth highest percentage of French speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Belknap County (sixth, Bulgarian), Hillsborough County (seventh, Sindhi), Hillsborough County (ninth, Kurdish), and Rockingham County (16th, Icelandic).
