Languages in Texas

- Harris County's 97 languages represented the 10th highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Texas counties that were highly ranked included: Dallas County (t-14), Tarrant County (t-23), Travis County (t-52), Bexar County (t-85), Denton County (t-108), Collin County (t-124), Fort Bend County (t-138) and El Paso County (t-194).
- Texas has the second highest percentage of Aztec and Spanish speakers of in the United States. The Lone Star State also ranks third in the percentage of Cajun and Pakistan (n.e.c.) speakers and fourth in the percentage of Czech, Malayalam and Vietnamese speakers.
- Webb County has the highest percentage of Spanish speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Fort Bend County (first, Urdu), and Maverick County (second, Spanish).
