Languages in Utah

- Salt Lake County's 79 languages tied for the 35th highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other Utah counties that were highly ranked included: Utah County (t-219), Weber County (t-266) and Davis County (t-277).
- Utah has the highest percentage of speakers of Afrikaans, Danish and Ute in the United States. The Beehive State also ranks second in the percentage of Bantu, Dutch, Paiute, Romy, Swedish and Tongan speakers and third in the percentage of Navaho and Samoan speakers.
- Salt Lake County has the second highest percentage of Tongan speakers of any county in the nation. Other counties that rank highly in a given language include: Uintah County (second, Ute), San Juan County (third, Navaho) and Salt Lake County (10th, Samoan).
