Languages in West Virginia

- Monongalia County's 27 languages tied for the 350th highest number recorded in any county in the United States. Other West Virginia counties that were highly ranked included: Kanawha County (t-388), Cabell County (t-650) and Wood County (t-650).
- West Virginia has the highest percentage of speakers of English in the United States. The Mountain State also ranks fourth in the percentage of Romany speakers and 13th in the percentage of Slovak speakers.
