

Eleven ports still have their own native colors and the surrounding areas offer different pleasures. The Incheonhang Port, close to Seoul, presents vitality of a port and colorful urban experience. The Busanhang Port, the largest port in Korea, offers a vibrant culture created in the process of international trade. The Donghaehang Port and the Sokchohang Port, the main ports of Gangwondo, welcome tourists with fresh seafood and shooting locations for popular Korean TV dramas and movies. The Pyeongtaekhang, Gunsanhang and Mokposinhang Ports offer a relaxing time against the backdrop of dotted islands and the breathtaking view of sunset in the West Sea. The Yeosuhang, Masanhang and Ulsanhang Ports wait for you in the blue and sparkling South Sea. If you want to visit a UNESCO World Heritage Site, visit the Jejuhang Port.

Korea found in the joy of shopping

Even if you seek an escape from daily life and a relaxing time in your trip, you might feel dull without shopping. Another pleasure in going on a trip is choosing souvenirs for your family and friends and something reminiscent of the trip. Korea is the right place for shopping. The world's largest department stores, glossy shopping towns open round the clock in every corner of the main and trendy streets for young and chic people. You will find the latest fashion trends in Korea. You will definitely enjoy choosing and shopping for things in traditional markets in each region. Historically, there have been a lot of markets





in Korea, where people from different regions have traded things. This long tradition has been successfully established thanks to fresh fruits and vegetables locally produced, fresh seafood caught the same day and carefully dried fish and dishes made of such fresh ingredients and sold in small alleys of markets. You will want to visit Korean markets again, as Koreans in the market are generous and warmhearted and usually give a little extra to buyers.

Traditional Korean food and finest regional delicacies you will taste for the first time

Food best represents a country's culture. However, you cannot talk about Korean food without mentioning Korean geography. To the north are rugged mountains and to the south are vast plains. Also, Korea is a peninsula surrounded by waters in every direction except the north. Therefore, Korean food use wild greens and medicinal herbs picked on mountains, grains harvested in the field and fresh seafood caught in the sea, in a balanced way. This is why a Korean meal strikes the right nutritional balance. If you have already tasted famous Korean food such as Kimchi, Bulgogi, Galbi and Bibimbap, then you must try a regional delicacy. Regional delicacies prepared using

locally produced ingredients might sound strange, but will definitely stimulate your five senses with beautiful shapes and sweet smells. Among regional delicacies are Mulhoi, a dish of sliced raw fish in a cool fish broth; Pajeon, baked pancake with green onions; Grilled Black Pork, grilled pork with fermented anchovy; soup with rice and noodles. These can only be found in traditional markets in each region. After the trip, you will miss these regional delicacies along with regional attractions.

Different experience according to the season

Korea has distinctive four seasons, as it has a temperate climate. Therefore, even if you visit the same place again, you will find completely different aspects according to the season. Spring is warm, so that it is a good season for outdoor activities. Many people go on flower viewing trips to mountains and fields covered with cherry blossoms, forsythia, azalea and royal azalea in spring. Summer is hot and sunny. People go to the beaches with fine sand and cool waves or valleys with cool streams in a thick forest to avoid the hot weather in summer. Autumn in Korea





is famous for clear skies and changing leaves. Hikers go to mountains to appreciate the changing leaves and enjoy freshly harvested fruits and grains. Winter turns Korea into a Wonderland covered with snow and ice. Skiers glide across slope with natural snow in ski resorts and tourists go to high mountains to see the spectacle of snow-capped trees. Korea, in four seasons, offers a lot to see and experience in any season. Choose when to visit Korea and wear clothes for the season. Then, indulge in Korea's hidden charms.

LOCATION The Korean Peninsula is located in the eastern tip of the Asian Continent along with other East Asian countries China and Japan. Its total area is 222,135km²; South Korea has 99,461 km² (41% of the land) and North Korea has 122,762 km² (55% of the land). The Korean Peninsula borders Manchuria of China and the Maritime Province of Siberia of Russia over the Yalu and the Turmen to the north, Japan over the East Sea and South Sea to the east and north and the mainland China over the West Sea to the west.



CLIMATE Korea has temperate climate

Korean Peninsula about 700,000 years ago when people started to settle down on the Korean Peninsula. In 2,000 BC, the Bronze Culture was introduced to the peninsula, leading to the establishment of Gojoseon, the first of several kingdoms in Korea's history. After Gojoseon perished in BC 108, the Three Nations emerged. After the Three Nations were united by United Silla Kingdom and when the United Silla Kingdom collapsed, Goryeo Kingdom was created. Goryeo Kingdom perished at the end of the 14th century. For the next 500 years, the Joseon Dynasty ruled the Korean Peninsula. Joseon was forcefully opened to the outside world by the Japanese in 1876 and colonized by Japan with the Japan-Korea Annexation Treaty in 1910. After liberalization in 1945, the Republic of Korea was founded. However, the Korean Peninsula was divided into South and North Koreas following the Korean War in 1950. Today, the two Koreas are engaged in various exchange programs to prepare for a re-unification.

It takes only 30 minutes by car from the Busanhang Port to downtown Busan, where major commercial banks, post offices and internet cafes are located. In addition, it takes 20 minutes on foot from the Busanhang Port to **Yongdusan Park**, where you can overlook downtown Busan and coastal waters and take some rest after longhours of voyage.

2 BEXCO

BEXCO is an eight-story building (7 floors aboveground and 1 floor underground) for international exhibitions and conventions. It includes a grand exhibition hall three times as large as a football field, a multipurpose hall, an outdoor exhibition space and a permanent display space. With advanced facilities, it has been selected as the venue for world-class exhibitions and conferences such as the 2002 FIFA World Cup Korea/Japan Final Draw, the 2003 ICCA Congress and Exhibition and the 2005 APEC Summit Meeting.

3 Busan Aquarium

Participants said that Nurimaru was the most beautiful APEC Summit Meeting venue ever. Beomeosa Temple

Beomeosa Temple is an old temple built during the Silla Kingdom 1,000 years ago. It is well-known for nurturing a lot of high Buddhist monks and spiritual leaders including Monk Uisang the Great, Monk Wonhyo the Great and Poet Manhae Han Yongun. Inside the temple are the main hall and other Buddhist buildings, a 1,400-yearold three-story stone pagoda and a beautiful temple bell. In front of the temple is a rattan colony and a climax forest which took more than 100 years to form. In this forest, you can enjoy strolling and meditation.

Taejongdae Resort

Taejongdae Resort is known for King Muyeol the Great (reign: 604 – 661) of the Silla Kingdom, being impressed by the beautiful scenery during his tour of the land and became a favorite place for him to practice archery. Taejongdae, consisting of sea cliffs and bizarre rocks, has 120 species of trees including black pines and a tourist ring road. You can take a cruise ship to look around the coastal spectacles including Suicide Rock and Taoist Hermit Rock and climb up a lighthouse with more than 100 years of history.

B Dongnae Spa

Dongnae Spa is one of the oldest hot springs in Korea and had been frequently visited by royal families and nobilities during the Silla Kingdom. In 1910, a Japanese opened an inn and bathing facilities here. The 55°C water contains alkaline, common salt and magnesium and is effective for stomach troubles, women's diseases, skin diseases and neuralgia. Every year, more than 4 million people visit Dongnae Spa.

O UN Memorial Cemetery

It is the only UN cemetery in the world. Soldiers from 11 countries killed during the Korean War are buried here, in

Gyeongju Historic Area

Gyeongju is a historical city registered as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2000. There are remains representing Silla Kingdom's history and culture scattered across the city. Among major relics are Mt. Namsan, which is full of Buddhist arts, remains of old palaces where roval families lived, grand tombs of Silla Kingdom's roval families and nobilities and historical Buddhist temples. Gyeongju is evaluated as a more valuable historical city than Kvoto or Nara in Japan, as there are many remains and relics densely located

Busan Fish Paste

Busan Fish Paste is a fried fish paste made of ground fresh fish caught in the sea off Busan, various vegetables and flour. Usually, Koreans eat boiled Busan Fish Paste in a broth of anchovy and beet. The zesty soup and chewy fish paste are combined to provide a very distinct flavor. Also, spicy fish paste in a soup of seafood and chilipepper paste is popular among spicy food lovers.

Soup with Rice

Soup with Rice is pork soup first prepared by North Koreans who fled to Busan during the Korean War. It is a brewed soup of pork and pig bones with big chunks of pork meat, vegetables such as chive, garlic, chili-pepper and onion, along with chili-pepper paste. As Soup with Rice offers enough pork meat and thick soup, one dish is enough to fill one's stomach.

Milmyeon

Milmyeon is similar to Naengmyeon, which is a buckwheat noodle dish in cold beef broth or in spicy marinade. However, Milmyeon is different from Naengmyeon in its ratio of flour and starch. Milmyeon is more chewy than flour noodle, but less chewy than Naengmyeon, which is made of buckwheat.



Dongnae Green Onion Pancake

Dongnae Green Onion Pancake is a baked pancake with toppings of tender green onion, sticky rice flour, egg and various seafoods. As it contains green onion full of vitamins and fresh seafood, it is highly nutritious. Also, it does not taste oily, especially if dipped on a mixture of red chili-pepper paste and vinegar.

Sea Eel

You can taste big and fresh sea eels in Nampo-dong of Busan, which is a major sea eel producer in Korea. Sea eels in spicy pepper paste grilled over straw or briquette fire, enjoy the smoky smell and flavor and chewyness.

Raw Fish

There are raw fish restaurants around Dadaepo, Haeundae and Jagalchi Market. These restaurants sell fresh seafood caught in the sea off Busan. In particular, live fish raw fish is popular among tourists.

The Incheonhang Port opened in 1883 and has been an important gateway for continental culture to enter Korea and for Korean culture to spread overseas. Today, Incheon is the largest gateway city to Korea with the Incheonhang Port and the Incheon International Airport. It is also the most vibrant city with people and goods flocking from countries around the world. You can feel both the blue sea off Incheon and urban life of Seoul, which is accessible from Incheon by subway, airport railway and bus.

Jongmyo Shrine

It is a Confucianism shrine honoring the ancestral tablets of kings and queens and where rituals are held during the Joseon Dynasty. It represents unique Korean characteristics of ceremony and architecture. Jongmyo Shrine is presumed to be the largest single wood architecture in the world. As it symbolizes solemn and refined Asian architecture and universal values of a religious architecture, it is called the "Parthenon of Asia," and has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1995.

Insa-dong

Insa-dong has been the center of arts since artists lived together there during the Chosun Dynasty. The current Insa-dong has been established, as bookstores and antique shops in the 1930s, traditional rice cake stores in the 1950s and art galleries in the 1970s opened there. Today, along the 700m-long Insa-dong street are modern buildings, Hanok houses, antique and old art shops, old furniture shops, art galleries, folk craft shops and traditional tea houses.

Jeju Volcanic Island listed on the UNESCO World Heritage List

Jeju is a volcanic island created through five volcanic eruptions 1 million years ago. At the center of the island is 1,950m-high Mt. Hallasan, with the Crater Baengnokdam Lake, on its summit. Lava spewed from the crater and flowed to the coast, creating numerous lava caves, coastal cliffs and coastal waterfalls in the process. Commissioners of the International Union for Conservation of Nature highly praised Jeju and called it "a unique beauty," when they visited Jeju as part of the evaluation for UNESCO World Heritage. In 2007, Mt. Hallasan, Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak (sunrise peak) and Geomunoreum lava tube system were listed on the UNESCO World Heritage List, which account for 10 percent of the land on Jejudo Island.

Hallasan National Park

Mt. Hallasan is a shield volcano located in the center of Jeju. It has 360 small and large parasitic volcanoes, the most belonging to one volcano. Also, Mt. Hallasan is also called the "Galapagos Island of Korea," as it shows different fauna and flora according to height and is home to rare plants and animals. Moreover, what's famous is Youngsil Rocks, a collection of bizarrely shaped rocks, presenting a mysterious landscape.

Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak Tuff Ring

When hot lava suddenly meets cold seawater, it becomes fine volcanic ash, which is accumulated around the crater to form a tuff ring, a crown-like shape. Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak is a typical tuff ring created in the process of underwater eruptions in shallow sea 100,000 years ago. It is very rare, in that it is a perfect crown shape.

Geomunoreum Lava Tube System A lava cave refers to a cave created after hot lava enters into cool and solid lava. There are about 120 lava caves on Jejudo Island. In particular, lava spewed from Geomunoreum formed 20 unusual caves. However, only Gimnyeongbaemgul Cave and Manjanggul Cave are open to public. Inside the cave, you can see white lime materials against the background of black wall made of lava.

Spirited Garden

It is an outdoor bonsai park built by a farmer who reclaimed a wasteland on his own and constructed a stone wall for three decades. It is now well-known to the world, as high-profile figures at home and abroad have visited the park and called it "a paradise garden." The garden looks like a parasitic volcano, which symbolizes Jeju's geography. There are about 4,000 pieces of bonsai trees.

The most popular section is "Mirror Room," where about 5,000 Pyrex glass pieces are used to form constellations. The room has mirrors in all directions shone by lights, offering a dreamy atmosphere of being in the center of universe.

Seopjikoji Coast

"Coji" means a cape in Jeju dialect. As its name suggests, Seopjikoji Coast is a cape jutting out into the sea. The cape looking like a gourd bottle on the sea front is made of basalt Peculiar rocks submerged or revealed according to height of surface of the sea present magnificent coastal scenery. On the land front is a vast field, which becomes full of vellow rape flowers in spring, attracting a lot of tourists and



photographers. Also, the cape is a filming location for All In starring Lee Byung-hun. There is still a chapel set called "ALL IN HOUSE." where would-be married couples take wedding photos. The chapel also provides a wedding ceremony, attracting many young couples.

O Udo Island

It is a volcanic island in the east of Jejudo Island. A 132.5m-high parasitic volcano is in the center of the island with a circumference of 17km. Lava flowing from the volcano created a unique volcanic geography across the island. A famous spot is the Seobinbaeksa Beach, which consists of numerous white pebbles made by red algae. It is very rare beach and looks magnificent against the blue sea.

Jeju Olle Trail is designed to promote people to walk on beautiful trails hidden in every corner of Jejudo Island, Since 2007, a total of 15 Olle Trail courses have been designated. These trails are popular among tourists, who want to appreciate the beauty of Jejudo Island while walking slowly.

Rice Porridge with Abalone


It is porridge with thinly-sliced abalone. Abalone porridge on Jejudo Island usually looks green with abalone intestines. Abalones caught around Jejudo Island are usually larger than those caught in other seas. As abalone porridge is not only flavorful but also highly nutritional, it is good for the elderly and those who are sick.

Raw Damsel Fish in Chilled Broth

It is a cold dish of raw damselfish with various spices, vegetables, water and ice cubes. As a traditional dish on Jejudo Island that offers chewy raw fish and cool soup, it is popular among Jeju people in summer

Grilled Black Pork

Black pigs are native pigs on Jejudo Island. They are mostly put to pasture; their meat tastes chewy and flavorful. Thick black pork meat is usually grilled on charcoal fire or a hot grill. With salt or fermented anchovy, it becomes more flavorful.

The sea off Mokpo was a main route for trade ships in the past. Therefore, undersea relics and antiquities are frequently discovered. It is the only underwater archaeological institute in Korea that preserves, exhibits and studies the remains of Korea's long maritime history. It now operates exhibition halls, which display old sunken ship remains and cultural properties and works on the life and culture of fishing villages and history of Korean ships. The Exhibition Hall 1 on Wando Island displays undersea relics

discovered in the sea off Wando-gun. Jeollanam-do and the Exhibition Hall 2 Shinan Region exhibits underwater antiquities discovered in the sea off Jeunado-myeon. Shinan-aun from 1976 to 1984 including 20,661 pieces of pottery. The Exhibition Hall 3 on Folk Fishing Village presents fishing activities and society, economic life and fishing village customs including fishing religion by fishers. The Exhibition Hall 4 on History of Ships shows ships according to times. The outdoor exhibition space displays Gageodo Fishing Boat, Fishing Boat for Catching Shrimp, Jejudo Island Rafts. hvdrofoil crafts and anchors of traditional boats.

There are hot spring theme parks around natural hot springs with more than 1.000 years of history in Chungcheongnam-do, attracting lots of tourists. In particular, spa resorts newly constructed in Asan are popular among tourists who seek health and rest. Asan Spavis has introduced agua therapy programs to stimulate body and spirit and Paradise Spa Dogo focuses on healing diseases, using hot spring water known as one of the top four quality hot spring in Asia. Both resorts have large bade pools and advanced aqua therapy facilities along with various event pools and sauna system.

Geumgang Migratory Bird Observatory

The Geumgang River is a famous habitat for tens of thousands of Baikal teals, which are rare migratory birds, in winter. The Geumgang Migratory Bird Observatory has an observatory to view migratory birds flocking to the Geumgang River, an exhibition hall on birds, a wild animal protection center, restaurants and an openair sculpture park. You can observe birds flying against the background of the Geumgang River and learn about the ecology of migratory birds using various facilities and specimens.

Shopping Tips

• You don't have to additionally pay a value added tax of 10 percent in Korea. As the value added tax is already included in the price, you have to pay in the listed price.

 You can use international credit cards such as VISA, MASTER, AMEX and JCB in stores (merchants only) as well as hotels, department stores and duty-free shops. Some shops in Itaewon and Myeong-dong, where lots of foreigners hang out, accept foreign currencies. However, if you exchange your money into Korean Won in advance, shopping will be a lot easier.





• If you want to have more side dishes in a restaurant, just say "Can I have more of this?" You can ask for side dishes several times without paying additional price.

• As the value added tax is included in the price of a product or service in Korea, you don't have to additionally give a tip. However, if you feel like you have received good service, you may leave a tip.

How to Use a Payphone

You can easily find a payphone in the streets or subway stations. There are two different payphones: those for coins and those for cards. As for international calls, please use a payphone for cards. You can buy a telephone card in values of 2,000 won, 3,000 won, 5,000 won or 10,000 won. The charge is relatively low at 33 won per minute. You can buy a telephone card in a nearby convenience store, post office, telephone station or bank.

Bank Hours

Banks open from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm in Korea. After or before the opening hours, you can withdraw cash from ATMs. Please check whether your credit cards can be used overseas in advance. During your Korea travel, you can use only credit cards with your names on them.



How to Use an Internet Cafe

If you need to check an e-mail or access a computer, an internet café is the answer. Korean internet cafes are named "PC Bang." which can be easily found along the streets. Once you enter a PC Bang, choose a plastic card at the entrance and find the computer matching the card number. If you turn on the computer and enter the serial number on the card. you can use the computer. The amount of time you have used the computer is displayed on the computer. Usually, the fee is 1,000 won per hour and the printing fee is 100 to 300 won, however, the fee might differ among PC Bangs.

EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SERVICE

1330 Travel Phone offers tourism information

The KTO(Korea Tourism Organization) has teamed up with the 119 emergency call center to establish the 1330 Travel Phone Emergency Interpretation Service to further assist tourists and expatriates in Korea during emergency situations. This service is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year in 3 languages_English, Japanese and Chinese. Calls take place in the form of a three-way phone conference between the 1330 Travel Phone, the 119 emergency call center and the caller requesting help.

Emergency Police Telephone Translation Service

The police operate a 112 emergency police telephone translation service. Tourists can dial 112 and be connected directly to an operator, a police officer or a translator and receive help immediately. Translation is available from 8 am to 11 pm on weekdays and 9 am to 6 pm on weekends in English, Japanese, Chinese, Russian, French, Spanish and German.

International SOS Korea

Provides 24-hour emergency service for foreigners, acting as a link between patients and Korea hospitals for a fee.


