Drug Enforcement Administration Diversion Control Division Guidance Document

**Title:** Reporting Theft, Loss, or Missing Sealed Inner Liners from Federal, State, Tribal, or Local Law Enforcement Agencies

**Summary:** This guidance document explains that Federal, State, tribal, or local law enforcement agencies have autonomy regarding the collection and disposal of controlled substances, and therefore, would not file a Report of Theft or Loss of Controlled Substances (DEA Form 106) with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) if a sealed inner liner is stolen, lost, or missing from a Federal, State, tribal, or local law enforcement agency.

Activity: Filing DEA Form 106 for Stolen, Lost, or Missing Sealed Inner Liners by Federal, State, Tribal, or Local Law Enforcement Agencies

**To Whom It Applies:** Federal, State, tribal, or local law enforcement agencies utilizing collection receptacles located inside the agency's physical address.

**Question:** Who is responsible for filing a DEA Form 106 if a sealed inner liner is stolen, lost, or missing from Federal, State, tribal, or local law enforcement agencies before the sealed inner liner is picked up for destruction or destroyed on-site?

**Answer:** Federal, State, tribal, or local law enforcement agencies may collect and dispose of controlled substances from ultimate users and other non-registrants as permitted by <u>21 CFR</u> <u>1317.30</u> and <u>1317.35</u>. Additionally, Federal, State, tribal, and local law enforcement agencies utilizing collection receptacles are exempt from the registration and reporting requirements otherwise imposed on DEA registrants. *See* <u>21 CFR 1301.24(a)-(b)</u>. Because the law enforcement agencies in this scenario are not registrants, they therefore would not be obligated to report thefts or significant losses of controlled substances to DEA, or file a DEA Form 106. *See* <u>21 CFR 1301.24(a)-(b)</u>; <u>21 CFR 1301.74(c)</u>; <u>21 CFR 1301.76(b)</u>. Such a law enforcement agency may nevertheless contact the DEA field office in its area if the law enforcement agency desires assistance with conducting its investigation if a theft or significant loss of a sealed inner liner occurs.
